A resolution to propose to the USG Senate an amendment to the Charter of the USG-GSG University Student Life Committee by amending Sections B of Article IV of said Charter, relating to the structure of Eating Club Relationship Subcommittee.

Resolved by the USG Senate that the Senate of Princeton USG at its 2017 Regular Session, commencing on the 12th day of November 2017, two-thirds of all members elected to the Senate voting in favor thereof, hereby proposes to the people of the Princeton University that Section B of Article IV of the Charter of the USG-GSG University Student Life Committee be amended as follows.

- 1. Section 1.a.ii to be replaced with "One (1) elected member of the USG Senate or Class Governments".
- 2. Section 1a.i to be removed.
- 3. Section 1.a.v to be amended from "Three (3)" to "Eight (8)" members-at-large.
- 4. Section 1.c to be amended to "The USLC Eating Club Liason and their co-chair shall serve as chairs of the subcommittee."
 - a. The language in sections 1.c.i and 1.c.ii updated from "Chair" to "Chairs."
- 5. Section 1.d.ii to be amended from "Chair" to "Chairs."

The Printer Group – Project Update

1. Meeting with OIT

• A few years ago, OIT determined that there was no location on campus that was more than three minutes walk from a printer.

- OIT is very amenable to adding new printers in limited number of high-traffic locations.
- At the same time, if there are printers that currently are not highly used, OIT would consider relocating them to the new spots.
 - Discussed giving USG anonymized data on printer use to determine high/low usage areas.
- OIT expressed sustainability concerns. Will increased printers cause an increase in printing? Any increase in number of printers on campus should be paired with a sustainability initiative to encourage decreased printing.
 - o In October alone, approximately one million pages were printed at Princeton, costing \$50,000.

2. Next Steps

- Finish creating heat map of printers on campus.
- Create survey for student feedback on where they need more printers, and identify most popular locations.
- Collaborate with OIT on analyzing current printer usage data.
- Collaborate with OIT on sustainability initiative to reduce total printing.
- Goal: come to agreement with OIT about adding printers by the end of the semester.

Academics Chair's Report

New Members

- George Rettaliata 2021 Nassau Weekly, Aquinas Society. A primary goal of his is to reevaluate the freshman course selection process in seeking to improve the current system of varying course selection times. The <u>3 PM</u> appointment time he was given ended in an inability to take all of the courses he had wanted to take and many of his fellow classmates experienced this same problem.
- Yousef Elzalabany 2020, Princeton Tonight, MSA, MASJID. Suggested a policy which allows students shopping classes to request extensions/leeway on assignments for the classes they ultimately select, within reason. To do this I'd like to formalize the shopping process so that professors can see proof that the students in question are shopping courses and not just trying to get an extension.
- Sara Hailu 2021. Involved with Princeton Club Archery and Princeton Ethiopian and Eritrean Student Association (PEESA). One of her main initiatives for academics at Princeton is raising more awareness about the incredible but underutilized aid that the McGraw Center provides for tutoring. She has already used the group tutoring service a number of times, but she has found that most of her fellow freshmen are underestimating, and thus not going to see, what it has to offer. Another initiative she has is improving the Peer Academic Advising system. By providing additional training for PAAs covering a broader range of academic topics (across different concentrations, for example) or having freshmen specialized to PAAs that share similar academic paths, PAAs could be more involved with and effective in freshmen's academic experience.
